Providing a comprehensive approach to autism treatment that focuses on the highest quality therapy to enrich the lives of children with autism and their families across all communities.

## Our Story

The Place for Children with Autism opened in January 2017 after founder Daniel Blank recognized a great need in the field of autism treatment — a need for a more comprehensive and results-driven therapy model, and perhaps an even greater need for access to intensive, early-intervention autism services in communities with limited options or support. Since opening its doors, The Place has perfected its model and grown rapidly, opening ten locations across Illinois.

The Place's success is contributed to its focus on clinical excellence and a unique approach to Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). The model allows for full-time therapy in a preschool-like setting where children, ages 2-6, have a one on one relationship with their therapist and a chance to interact with others their age. Its success goes beyond therapy sessions and into the homes and lives of each of these children.

"I've seen kids that have been with us since the very beginning who are now aging out and the changes are breathtaking," Blank said. "We say this, but I also really believe it: we change lives for the better, and that has a huge impact across the board from their parents, siblings, grandparents, aunts and uncles, schools and houses of worship — the impact is enormous. Knowing that through one child, we have this much impact — it's incredible."



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### Fact Sheet

#### Therapy

- The Place for Children with Autism solely provides Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapy.
- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is the application of behavior analytic principles, or learning theories, to increase socially significant behaviors and decrease challenging behaviors. Behaviors or skills can be broken down into small, teachable steps to help the learner gain independence in mastering that skill.
- Each center has a one to one child to therapist ratio. The centers are intentionally kept small, serving an average of 10 to 18 children at each location.
- Since its inception in January 2017, The Place for Children with Autism has provided services to about 100 children.
- Each location is strategically opened in neighborhoods where children with autism have limited therapy options, fulfilling one of The Place's main missions to make the best clinical services available to everyone.
- In addition to providing top quality services, The Place for Children with Autism also helps families find ways to help cover therapy costs, through best-suited insurance plans, grants and other resources.
